#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** First class & tourist hotels based on twin occupancy with bath. Hotel category determined through documentation published by O.H.R.G. Single-room supplement \$950.

**MEALS:** American Buffet and (in Israel the famous Israeli breakfast buffet), breakfast, and dinner daily throughout the tour. *Except that no meals are provided in USA.* Extra charge for coffee, tea or other beverage not included in the menu of the day. If a passenger chooses not to have a meal, there will be no refund for unused meals.

**TIPS AND TAXES:** Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included, as are all governmental and local taxes on hotels and meals.

**SIGHTSEEING:** By modern motor coach including services of English speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary.

**NOT INCLUDED:** Passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, mineral waters and after-dinner coffee or tea, meals not included in the itinerary, room service, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned. **TRAVEL INSURANCE** (optional), Maranatha Tours Inc. will automatically bill all passengers for travel insurance unless it is declined at the time of reservation or in writing by the participant.

**PASSPORTS, VISAS:** A valid US passport is required for US citizens. If you do not have a passport please contact your local passport office. Passports must be valid 6 months after return date. For all other nationalities please consult the country's consulate.

**TOUR PRICE:** Price is based on international tariffs and rates in effect on Date of proposal and is subject to change without notice should there be a revision in AIR or LAND rates prior to departure of tour. Price is based on a minimum of passengers using double occupancy. In the event that a minimum of passengers does not book the tour within 45 days of departure the agent reserves the right to cancel or re-cost the tour. Late booking or changes may result in an additional fee. Maranatha Tours, Inc. reserves the right to correct invoices, itineraries, and/or brochures without notice.

**LAND ONLY:** From time to time a tour may be canceled due to not materializing. If you choose to purchase a land only package and arrange your own domestic and international flight independently, Maranatha Tours Inc. will not be responsible for domestic, international flights or transfers of any kind. Maranatha Tours is not responsible for any international flight schedule changes.

If domestic tickets are purchased by an individual, all penalties and fare differences will be paid by the client.

**DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION:** A deposit of \$300 per person is required to secure reservations, which will be applied to the price of the tour. The balance to be paid in full not later than 6 weeks prior to departure of the tour. Thereafter, a \$100 late payment fee will be assessed. Reservations made within 30 days of departure are subject to \$75 late reservation charge. All cancellations must be in writing by letter, fax or e-mail to Maranatha Tours and will be in effect on the date of receipt by Maranatha Tours. There is no exception to cancellation fee. Any exceptions must be in writing from Maranatha Tours, Inc. Air penalties are not part of the percentages below and vary based on the airline policy at the time of ticket issue.

**AIR TRANSPORTATION:** A round-trip economy class jet; via International air carrier or any other IATA member. Full payment is due 45 days prior to commencement of travel. If the passenger cancels within 35 days of departure or after air tickets are written (whichever comes sooner), then 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger. In the event 35 passengers do not book the tour within 90 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

**AIR--**Because the travel dates are more than 6 months away, the costs and schedules could change. Please Note: A New York overnight may be necessary for any groups traveling from the West Coast, either on the outbound or return.

**ITINERARY CHANGES:** If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$90 per night; single rooms- \$130 per night. Meals for extra nights are not included.

**CHANGE FEE:** All changes not received in writing by Maranatha Tours at least 45 days prior to departure will incur a \$75 change fee per person for each revision (that is in addition to any other charges per revision once the basic or pre/post tour package has been confirmed).

**LAND ARRANGEMENTS:** The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary due to emergencies.

**DEVIATIONS:** Deviations will incur a \$125 fee, plus any other additional costs associated with services included in the basic or pre/post tour. Transfers are included in our group round-trip programs, passengers who deviate or purchase land only packages will be responsible for arriving and leaving independently and must transfer at their own expense.

**CREDIT CARDS:** All credit card transactions processed by Maranatha Tours directly are subject to a 5% processing fee (excluding the original \$300 deposit).

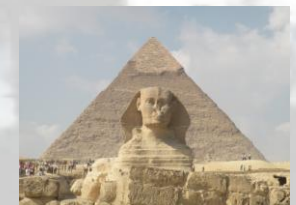

**DAY 1 - Tuesday, February 08, 2011  
NEW YORK / ISTANBUL**

Tour members are welcomed at JFK International Airport for our departing flight to Istanbul via wide-body aircraft arriving the next day. Meals served on board.

**DAY 2 - Wednesday, February 09, 2011  
ISTANBUL / TEL AVIV / TIBERIAS**

This morning we will arrive in Istanbul and transfer to our flight to Tel Aviv.

Upon arrival in Tel Aviv we are met by our guide who will be with us for the time we are in the Holy Land. Continue through Tel Aviv, the largest city in Israel. We proceed up the new toll road in Israel to the famous Sea of Galilee where we check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 3 - Thursday, February 10, 2011  
TIBERIAS / BET SHEAN / SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS**

We begin the day by sailing on the Sea of Galilee, drive up to the Mount of Beatitudes, continue to Capernaum, and stop at Bethsaida, the home of Peter, Andrew and Philip, where Jesus performed many miracles. In Luke's account the feeding of the 5000 occurred in this area. Continue driving around the eastern shores of the Sea of Galilee, head south to Ein Gev for a St. Peter's Fish lunch. After lunch drive south through the Jordan Valley to Beth Shean which is the setting for the death of King Saul. Our last stop today will be at the River Jordan and then back to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 4 - Friday, February 11, 2011  
TIBERIAS / NAZARETH / CAESAREA / JERUSALEM**

We leave the Sea of Galilee for Jerusalem, on the way visiting Nazareth, boyhood home of Jesus. We will stop and visit Mary's well and the Nazareth Village. Ascend the Mount of the Precipice at the brow of Nazareth to overlook the Valley of Jezreel, synonymous with Armageddon. Drive through the valley to the mound of Megiddo, the site of over 20 civilizations. Ascend Mt. Carmel and drive towards the Mediterranean coast to Caesarea by the Sea. Explore this area and pass through Tel Aviv on our way to Jaffa, the city of Jonah. Proceed on the road through the Aijalon Valley to a first view of Jerusalem from Mt. Scopus. Check in to hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 5 - Saturday, February 12, 2011  
MT. OF OLIVES / SOUTHERN WALL / YAD VASHEM**

We start the day with an orientation to Jerusalem by driving around the Walls of Jerusalem and then continue

to the Mt. of Olives. We then walk the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Flevit ("Our Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, we walk downhill to Gethsemane, where we take time to meditate on the Gospel text. Boarding our bus we drive to the Dung Gate. Just inside we walk to the Southern Wall excavations. We then examine the ruins near the south side of the Temple complex, including steps where we may be certain that Jesus and the disciples walked, then to the slopes of Mt. Zion where we will visit the Upper Room and King David's Tomb.

We see the Jewish Quarter of the Old City and then proceed to the Shrine of the Book, home of the Dead Sea Scrolls, and continue to visit Yad Vashem, the holocaust memorial museum. To the hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 6 - Sunday, February 13, 2011  
OLD CITY / WAY OF THE CROSS / GARDEN TOMB**

Today we visit the Church of Pater Noster and the Chapel of Ascension, then proceed to the Garden of Gethsemane. Crossing the Kidron Valley, we pass the tombs of Absalom, Zechariah and St. James, then visit the Pool of Siloam and the Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu (Caiaphas' House).

We enter the Old City this afternoon through the Zion Gate and see the Cardo and the remains of Nehemiah's Wall on the way to the Western (Wailing) Wall. We visit the Dome of the Rock on the Temple Mount (it is believed that here the temple once stood), the Church of St. Anne, the Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall. We follow the Via Dolorosa (Way of the Cross) to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and end our day in the Garden Tomb where we will have a private communion service, before returning to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 7 - Monday, February 14, 2011  
JERUSALEM / MASADA / JERICHO / DEAD SEA**

We begin our day with a stop at Bethany, home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus. We travel to Jericho, the world's oldest city. From the excavated tel atop the ruins of ancient Jericho we view the lush green Jordan Valley, Elisha's spring and Qarantal, the Mount of Temptation. We then drive to Masada and ascend by cable car to the magnificent ruins of the fortress where, from 70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean revolt against Rome. We see the remains of storehouses, cisterns and a sixth-century Byzantine church.

This afternoon we continue to Qumran and the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Continuing alongside the Dead Sea, 1300 ft. below sea level -- the

lowest spot on earth -- we proceed to Ein Gedi. Here we will have a stop and walk the path to see the waterfall in the desert. We end our day at our hotel at the Dead Sea where the rest of the afternoon will be free. Dinner and overnight at our hotel on at the Dead Sea.

**DAY 8 - Tuesday, February 15, 2011  
DEAD SEA / EILAT / TABA / RAS SADR**

This morning we will have time to swim in the Dead Sea or take a mud bath that is known to cleanse many skin disorders. We will head south to Solomon's Quarries where we will see a replica of the tabernacle that housed the Ark of the Covenant. We continue south to Eilat on the Red Sea. This is the Old Testament Ezion-geber, where King Solomon had his famous smelting factories. Today it's a vacation playground.

After crossing the border at Taba into Egypt and passing through customs formalities, we'll meet our bus and Egyptian guide who will lead us through the desert Sinai to Ras Sadr. Check in to the hotel for dinner and overnight. Enjoy the cool desert evening at leisure.

**DAY 9 - Wednesday, February 16, 2011  
RAS SADR / ELIM / VALLEY OF SIN 4x4 TRIP / CAIRO**

This morning we journey onward to Elim. This is the site where the Israelites discovered 12 wells of water and 70 palm trees (Exodus 15:27). Near here God began to provide manna and quail for the hungry Hebrews (Exodus 17:1-18). We are in the Valley of Sin (Numbers 33:9-11) where the grumbling Israelites wandered for 40 years. And for you—a special treat. We'll take 4 x 4 wheel drive vehicles and challenge the desert ourselves. There will be 6 of us in each vehicle as we see Egyptian mines and desert rock carvings. I'm thinking you don't have any friends who have done this! We will have a Bedouin style barbeque in the wilderness.

In the afternoon we will make our way to Marah. You remember Marah--Israel's first stop after crossing the Red Sea where the water was bitter and God told Moses to throw a piece of wood into it and the water turned sweet. This would be a good place to thank God for all the basics of life we take for granted. Continue to the Suez Canal and on to Cairo, where we check into our hotel for dinner.

**DAY 10 - Thursday, February 17, 2011  
PYRAMIDS / SPHINX / EGYPTIAN MUSEUM / COPTIC CAIRO**

After breakfast, our first stop will be at the Pyramids. We will walk around Cheops Pyramid, the largest, that was built approximately 2690 B.C. We also visit the Pyramid of Chephren and see the Great Sphinx, who has stood

guard over the pyramids all these years. The Sphinx was carved from a single piece of stone. It is a lion with a Pharaoh's head thought to be a portrait of the Pharaoh Chephren. Here we will be able to ride a camel by the Pyramids area.

Travel through Cairo crossing the Nile to Old Cairo to explore the City's medina and alabaster mosque. Continue on to visit the greatest collection of Pharaonic treasures in the world at the famous Egyptian Museum. Visit the Old Kingdom Collection, Middle and New Kingdom galleries and Greco-Roman periods and you do not want to miss Tut-Ankh-Amon treasures that visited the USA several years ago. We will go to Coptic Cairo, where we will visit the famous Hanging Church, named "Al-Mu'allaqah". Continue to the Church of St. Sergius, a 5th century Coptic Church. Here is where the Holy Family stayed and is regarded by visitors as a source of blessing. We go to the recently restored Synagogue of Ben Ezra. This is the oldest Jewish synagogue in Egypt built in 882 AC. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

**DAY 11 - Friday, February 18, 2011  
CAIRO / NEW YORK**

This morning we will transfer to the airport for our flight home with unforgettable memories to cherish always. Knowing we have walked in the footsteps of Jesus and the early Christians on such a memorable tour will bring new meaning to our Bible reading.
